Hispanic-Serving Institutions Week Toolkit

PURPOSE OF THE TOOLKIT

This toolkit has been developed to aid Hispanic-Serving Institutions (HSIs), partners, supporters, policymakers and any individuals and organizations who want to celebrate and amplify the work being done by HSIs across the country. Tagging HACU on any social media platform that you use will allow us to like and boost your post.

National HSIs Week Sept. 9-15, 2024, takes place during National Hispanic Heritage Month, celebrated Sept. 15-Oct. 15. Each year, HACU works with members of Congress to recognize the contributions of Hispanic-Serving Institutions in their communities. HSIs are defined as having 25% or more undergraduate Hispanic student full-time equivalent (FTE) enrollment.

In 2021-22, there were 600 institutions that met the definition of an HSI and they enrolled 66.2% of all Hispanic undergraduates and 31.7% of all undergraduate students in nonprofit postsecondary education. These are some of the reasons HSIs Week is observed by colleges and universities across the nation - to celebrate the vital role these institutions play in educating the fastest growing demographic in the U.S.

This social media toolkit is designed to help you heighten awareness of the important role HSIs play in improving access to education and advancing equity for traditionally underserved students.

We encourage you to share this toolkit with others in your organization, as well as partners and other stakeholders to help celebrate HSIs.

The toolkit includes graphics and text that can be easily copied for inclusion with your own social media posts. Using the hashtag **#HSIsWeek** allows HACU and other institutions, partners and individuals to find and amplify your posts during HSIs Week, even when you use your own text as the body of the post.

HISPANIC HIGHER EDUCATION FACTS TEXT

20% of all higher ed colleges and universities in the U.S. are Hispanic-Serving Institutions and serve two-thirds of all Hispanic college students. #HSIsWeek

The majority of the top 20 institutions with the highest ROI at the bachelor's level are Hispanic-Serving Institutions and emerging HSIs. #HSIsWeek

Hispanic students earned 16.3% of bachelor's degrees conferred in 2022, compared to 13.2% in 2011. #HSIsWeek

Hispanic students earned one out of four (25.9%) associate degrees conferred in 2021, compared to 13.2% in 2011. #HSIsWeek

In the fall of 2022, 3.2 million Hispanic undergraduate students were enrolled in nonprofit postsecondary institutions. #HSIsWeek

The percent of STEM degrees conferred to Hispanic students rose from 9.2% to 15.6% between 2009 and 2022. #HSIsWeek

Hispanic enrollment in higher education is expected to exceed 4.3 million students by 2026, far surpassing the growth rate of any other racial-ethnic group by over 10%. #HSIsWeek

There are 3.8 million Hispanic graduate and undergraduate in nonprofit postsecondary education. HSIs enroll 32.2% of Pell Grant recipients. #HSIsWeek

HSIs enroll 5.2 million students. Graduate total = 498,717. Undergraduate total = 4,678,264. Total students = 5,176,981. #HSIsWeek

HSIs and Emerging HSIs are present in all but 7 states, including those less known for their Hispanic population, such as North Carolina, Kansas, and Georgia. #HSIsWeek

HSI growth from 2010, when HSIs numbered 311, has now reached 600. This has shown an increase on average by 25 institutions per year, prior to the COVID pandemic. In 2021, there was an increase by 13 institutions after a decrease in 2020 due to the pandemic.

The percentage of U.S. undergraduate students at HSIs by race/ethnicity is Hispanic 66.2%, Asian 41.4%, Native Hawaiian & Pacific Islander 35.5%, Other 24%, Black 24%, American Indian & Alaska Native 21%, White 16%. HSIs enroll 65% of Hispanic undergrads & 30% of all undergrads. #HSIsWeek

California, Florida, Illinois, New Mexico, New York, Puerto Rico, and Texas are home to 489 HSIs or 82% of these institutions. #HSIsWeek

A majority of HSIs are in urban areas and concentrated geographically, with 82% located in 6 states and 1 territory: California (170), Florida (32), Illinois (31), New Mexico (24), New York (37), Texas (102) and Puerto Rico (59). #HSIsWeek

In 2022, 3.2 million Hispanic undergraduate students were enrolled in nonprofit postsecondary institutions, earning 25.9% of associate degrees in 2022, and 16.3% of bachelor's degrees conferred in 2022. #HSIsWeek

600 HSIs are in 193 Congressional Districts, in 28 states, Washington D.C., and Puerto Rico. #HSIsWeek

Of all HSIs in the U.S., 178 are 4-year public, 234 are 2-year public, 180 are 4-year private, and 8 are 2-year private. #HSIsWeek

Many Hispanic students are often the first in their families to attend college. HSIs are focused on being welcoming and accessible to parents, guardians and students to assure their higher education success, and represent all students and their families. #HSIsWeek

HSIs can offer specialized resources and support services to help students succeed academically, including academic advising, tutoring services, and mentoring programs. HSIs can also have specialized programs and centers to support Hispanic students. #HSIsWeek

In 1976, Hispanic students made up just 4% of all college students but by 2019, that number grew to nearly 22% of college students and now rank as the second-largest racial/ethnic group in higher ed today. #HSIsWeek

One advantage HSIs possess is gaining access to grants from the Department of Education. Colleges and universities can apply for funds which are usually focused on student success and retention. #HSIsWeek

Many HSIs have strong ties to their local community, an education experience accessible to students of all incomes and backgrounds, a commitment to social equity, and a campus climate where students and employees feel a sense of connection and belonging. #HSIsWeek

Diversity on any campus makes the community better and stronger, to be innovative and creative with diverse ideas and perspectives. HSIs prepare students of every background to interact and thrive in a globally interconnected society. #HSIsWeek
