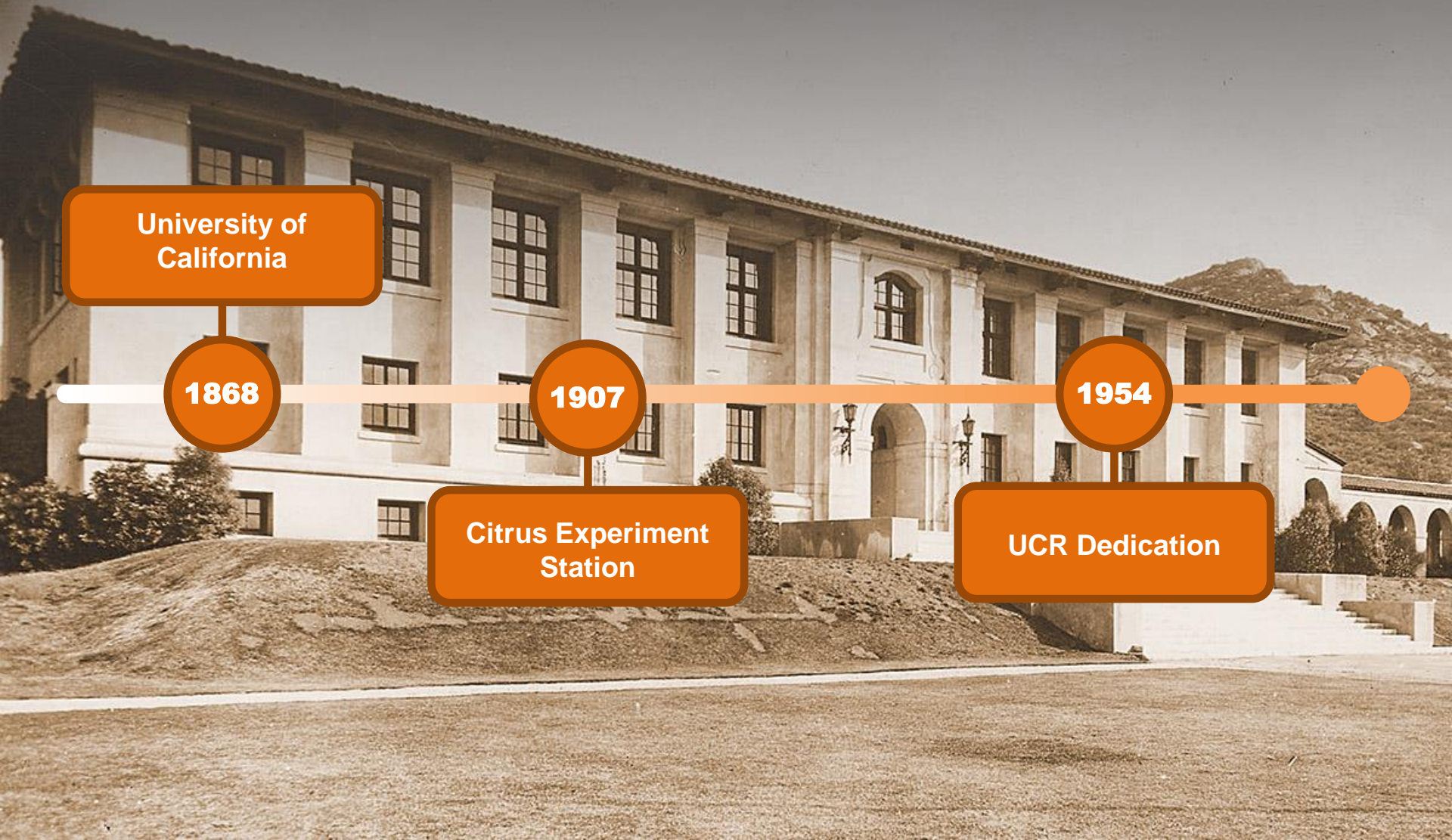

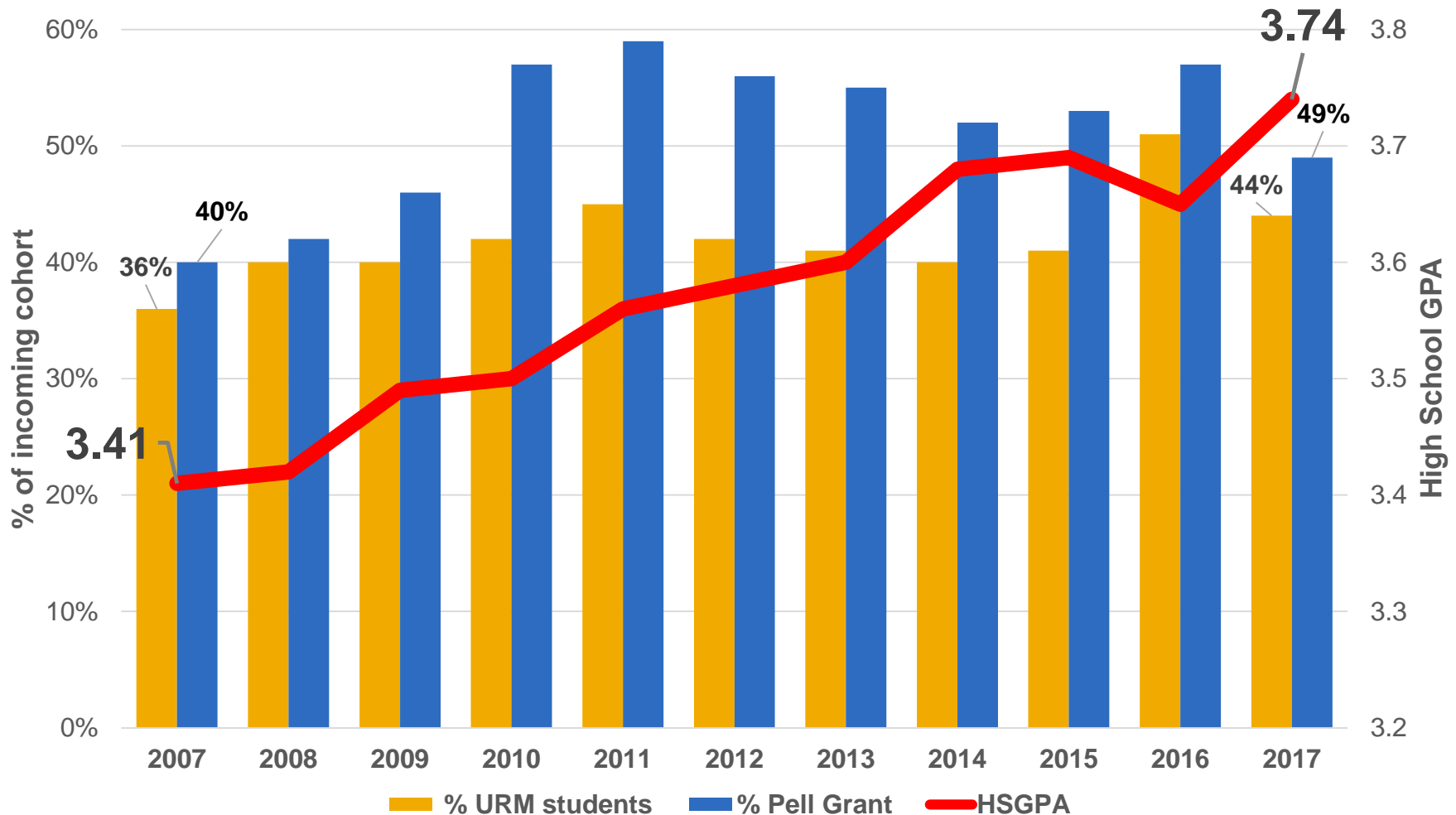

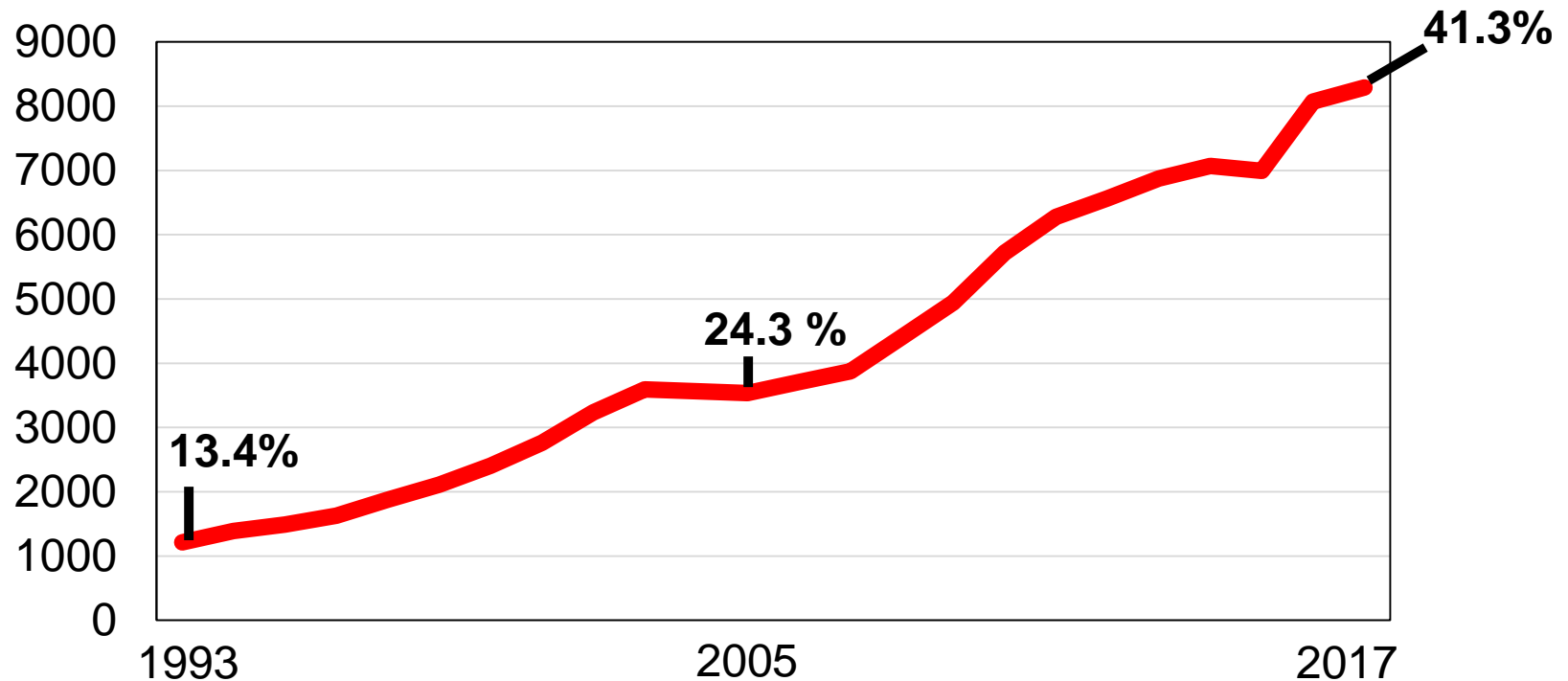
- In 1979 Tomás Rivera, became the first Latino and the first minority chancellor in the UC system.

Incoming freshmen: High school GPA compared to percent underrepresented minority, Pell Grant recipients



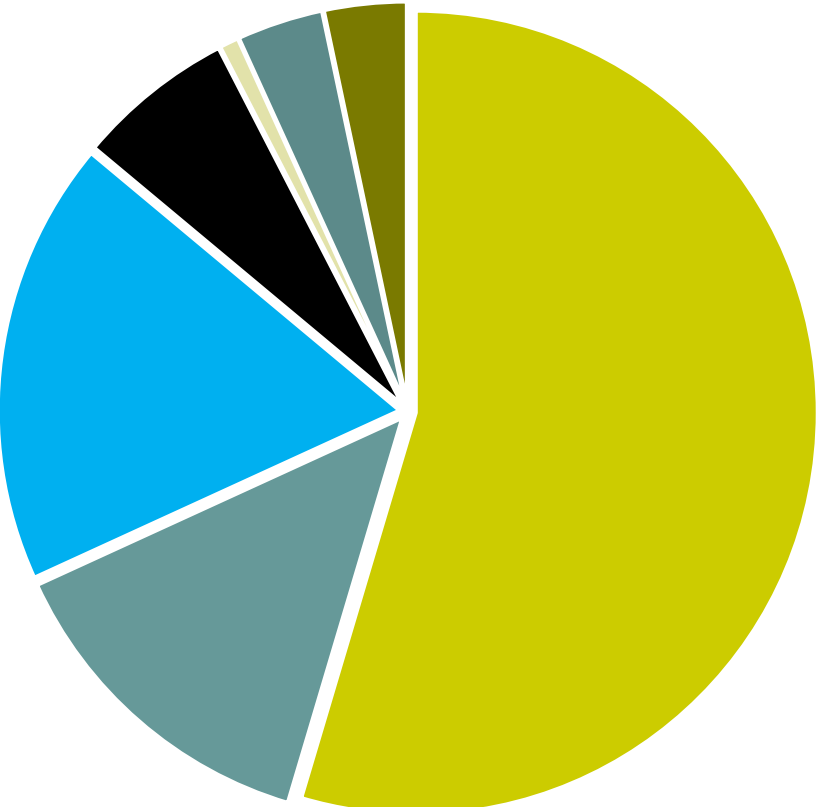
Latino Student Enrollment (1993-2017)

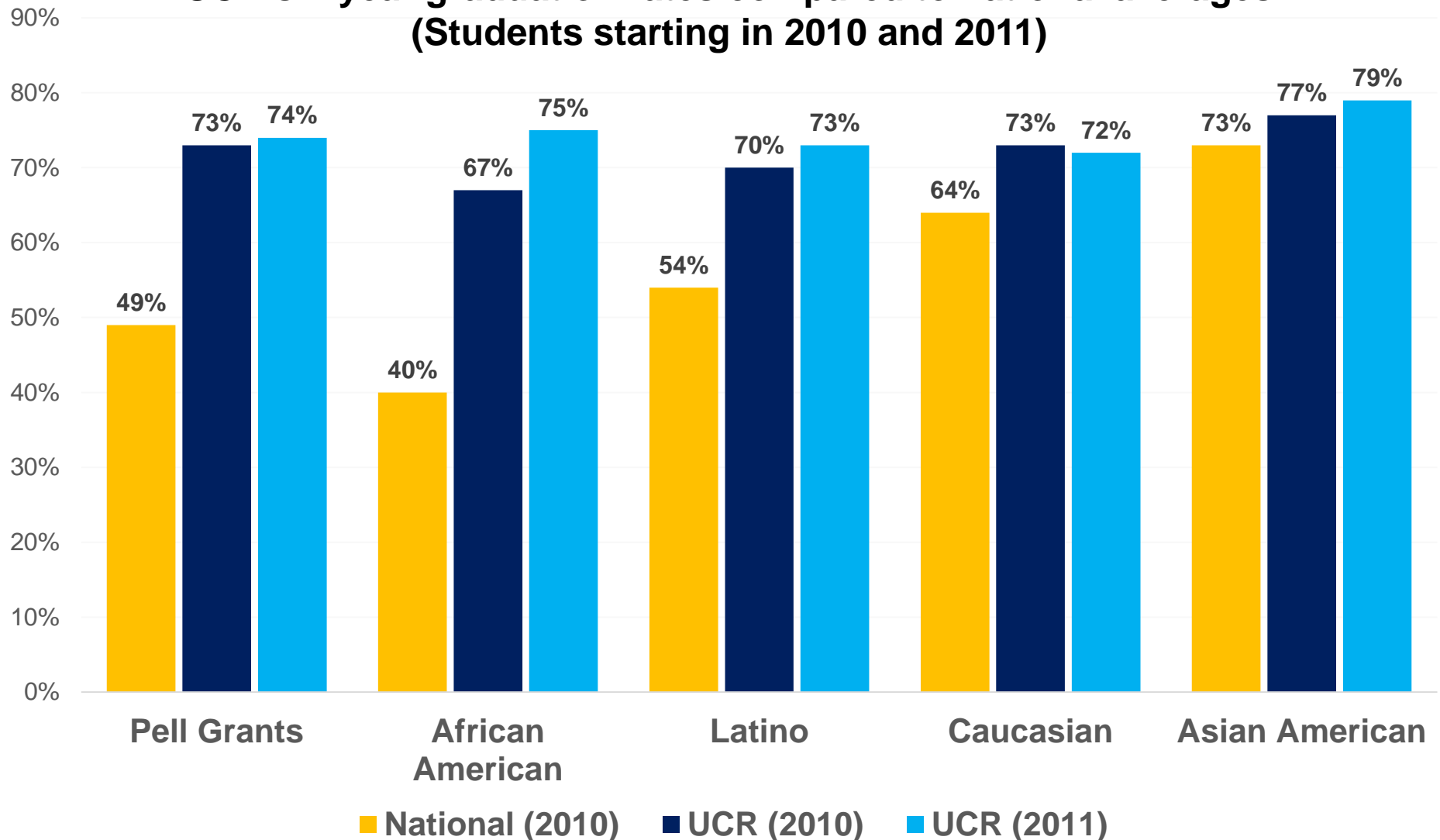

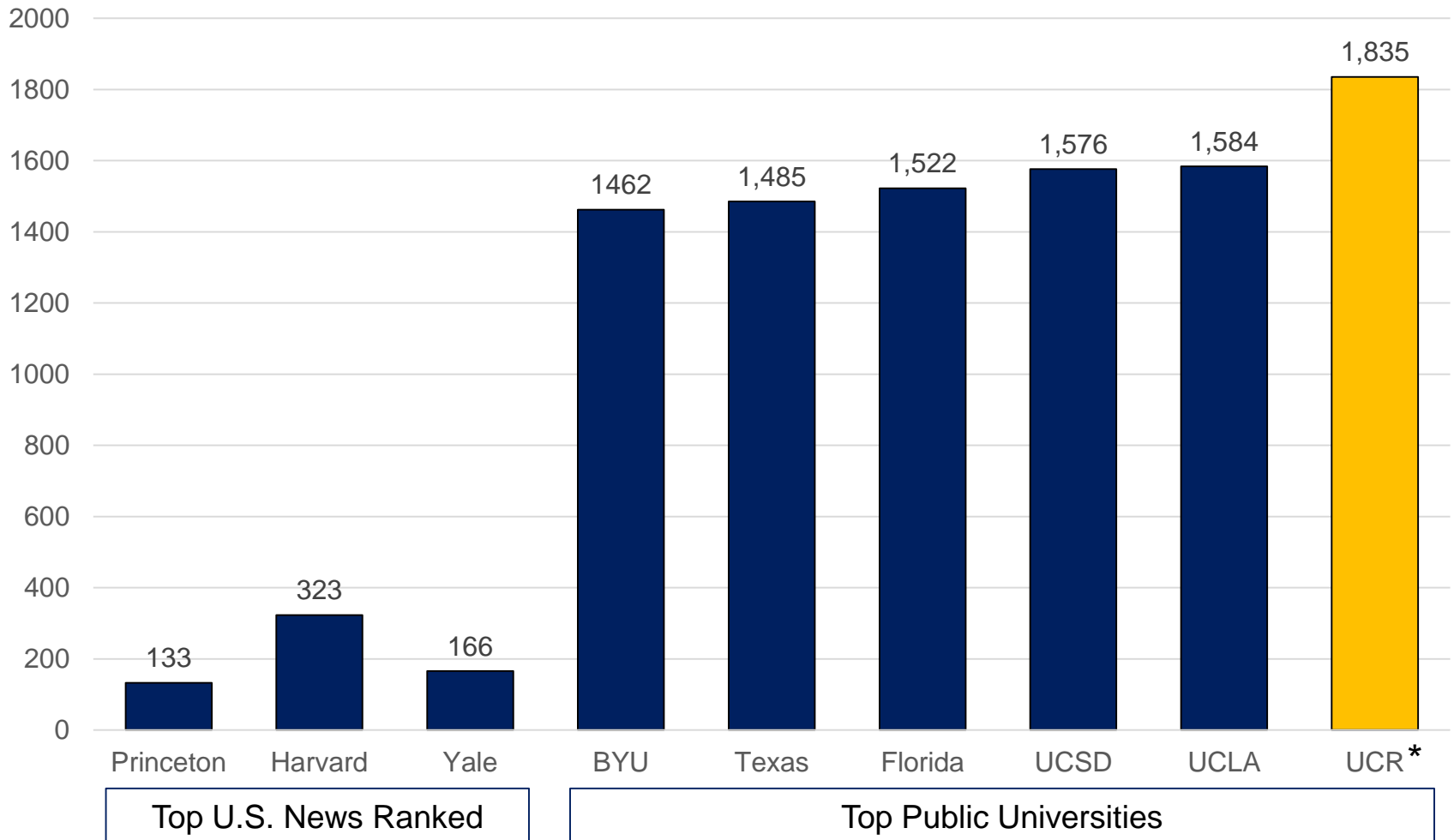
**UCR six-year graduation rates compared to national averages

- ✓ percentage of students enrolling in post-secondary education from 52% to 65%
- ✓ percentage of students who are college ready

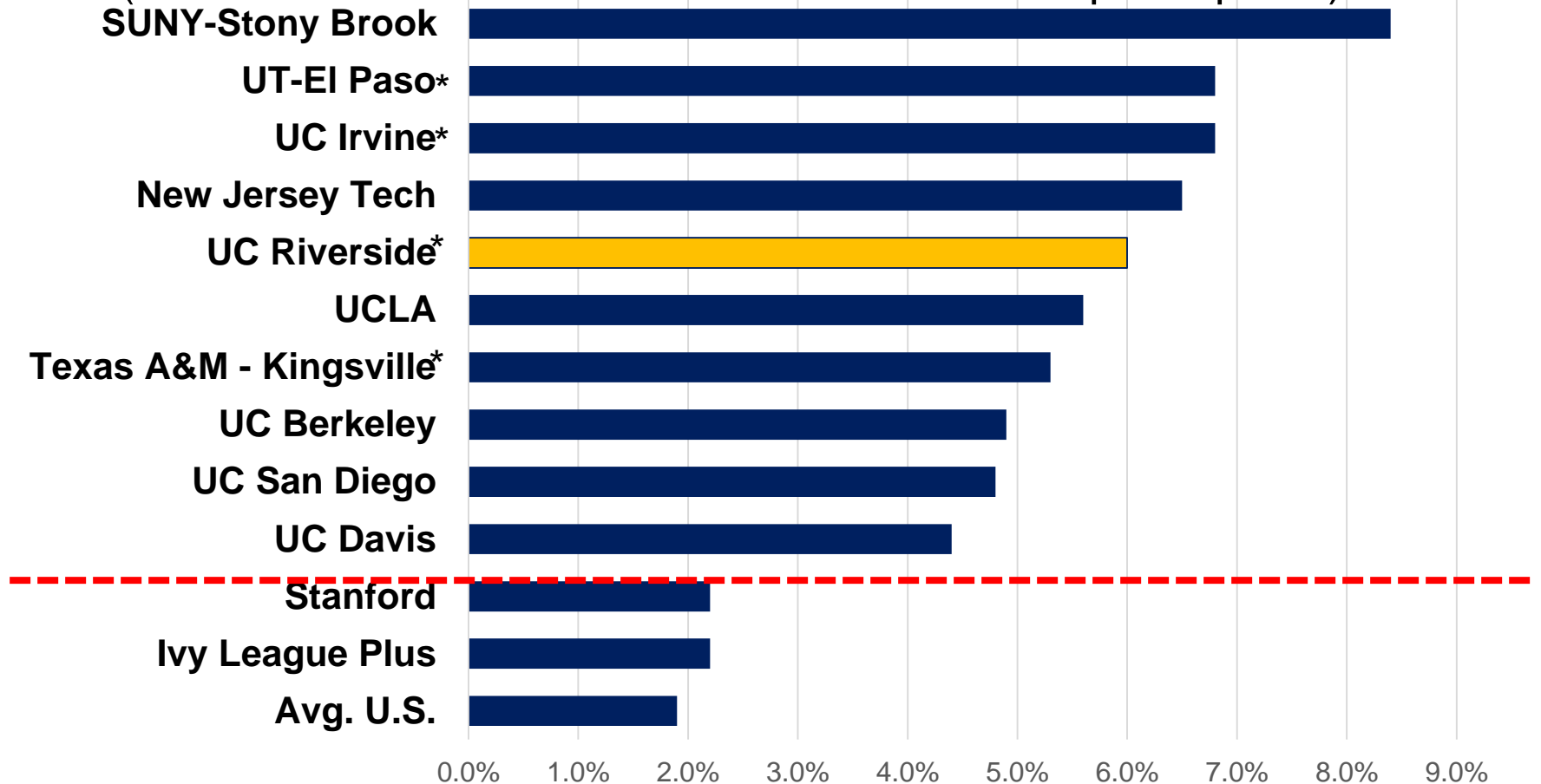


Student Success Isn't Enough
