

Letter from President and CEO



elcome and thank you for joining us at our most important advocacy event, the Hispanic Association of Colleges and Universities' National Capitol Forum on Higher Education in Washington, D.C. Every year HACU brings together administrators, faculty, staff and students from the Association's member institutions to meet with elected officials and government leaders and advocate for the legislative priorities of Hispanic-Serving Institutions. After its founding in 1986, HACU hosted its first Capitol Forum in Washington, D.C. in 1995, and this year marks the 30th anniversary of the Capitol Forum event bringing delegations to Capitol Hill.

Colleges and universities are essential to a thriving economy and our nation's future as a global leader. Your voice is crucial to America's continued success and prosperity, and our leaders need to hear directly from you the need to take action in supporting HSIs and the students they serve.

The two-day Forum commences with pre-conference workshops. The Opening Plenary luncheon will be followed by a Unity Plenary, then a discussion of HACU's Legislative Agenda, as well as sessions with speakers and presenters on the current issues HSIs and their supporters are facing. We will also be hosting a "Status of Dreamers and DACA Recipients: A Forum" event on May 1, to discuss the challenges faced by Dreamers and DACA recipients.

HACU asks that while you are on your Capitol Hill visits, you advocate for greater federal investments in HSIs and request congressional support in six priority areas: equitable funding for HSIs; the passage of the HERE Act; increasing authorization levels for Title V-Part A and Title V-Part B; immigration reform; increasing the Pell Grant; and establishing a Capital Financing Program for HSI infrastructure upgrades. These conversations are necessary to convince our congressional leaders that greater federal investment in HSIs and programs that contribute to student success are essential to not only HSIs and their students but all colleges and universities in our country.

Our voices together are stronger and can make the difference in pressing legislators to increase federal funding for these institutions vital to the future success of future generations. We hope you will share HACU's Legislative Agenda, higher education priorities and resources shared at this Forum with your campus communities and leaders and encourage them to engage members of Congress and enlist others in continued advocacy supporting our HSIs.

HACU's Governing Board always provides exemplary leadership and guidance to advance our mission, for which they have our thanks, as well as our Corporate and Philanthropic Council for their unwavering support. All our sponsors and partners have our gratitude for their contributions towards making this event possible. And we are especially grateful that you are a part of this year's Capitol Forum to champion success in higher education for all our students.
